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Request for Proposal To *Qualified Providers*

Project Type: **Early Start Program: Physical Therapist**

Deadline for Submission: **Until filled**

Description of Project:

Valley Mountain Regional Center has the immediate need for a licensed Physical Therapist to serve our Early Start consumers (birth-three-year-old). VMRC's Early Start program serves infants and toddlers who have an eligible condition, that if left untreated, may result in a developmental delay. The Early Start Physical Therapist is needed to provide a motor assessment, recommendation for ongoing service need, and to provide ongoing direct therapy service with the consumer and family. In addition, the service would be provided in the infant/toddler's home and/or other natural environment setting.

The Physical Therapist is needed in **Amador, Calaveras, and/or Tuolumne County**.

The Physical Therapist (PT) would be expected to provide in-home training and support to families of infants/toddlers with a motor developmental delay. The PT would work collaboratively with VMRC's Intake Coordinator to complete an initial assessment when an infant/toddler is referred for services due to a suspected motor developmental concern. The PT should be familiar with the DAYC-2 assessment tool and other assessment tools that may assist to better understand the infant/toddler's motor needs. The PT will collaborate with the interdisciplinary team and participate in the Individual Family Service Plan (IFSP) with the family. The PT must be willing to provide timely, accurate reports, with recommendations for ongoing services to address the infant/toddler's motor concerns.

Rates for this service are established using Standard Medi-Cal Allowance/ Service Code 772.

Agency Overview:

Valley Mountain Regional Center (VMRC) is a private, non-profit organization working under contract with the State of California, Department of Developmental Services. VMRC provides services to persons age birth to three, who are at-risk of developing a developmental disability, and three years and older, who have a developmental disability.

Valley Mountain Regional Center creates partnerships to support all eligible individuals with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities, children at risk, and their families in choosing services and supports through individual lifelong planning to achieve healthy and productive lives in their own communities. VMRC envisions a community where individuals with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities are valued members who are treated with dignity and respect. Eligibility of Applicants (either sole proprietors or agencies):

Applicants must be able to provide relevant licenses, certifications and/ or credentials as required by the State of California to practice in the field being offered. The applicant is also trained to use DAYC-2 assessment tool, and other tools to assess infant/toddler’s motor skills. A *minimum, one year of experience working with persons with developmental disabilities is required.*

Criteria for Selection:

All applications submitted that meet the minimum eligibility requirements shall be considered for vendorization. VMRC reserves the right to select a provider for the services described in this Request for Proposal without further negotiations. VMRC may, at its sole discretion, select no applicant for these services if, in its determination, no applicant is sufficiently responsive to the need.

Costs for Proposal Submission:

Applicants responding to this Request for Proposal shall bear all costs associated with the development and submission of their RFP Application Packet. No costs shall be charged to VMRC, the Department of Developmental Services, or the State of California.
